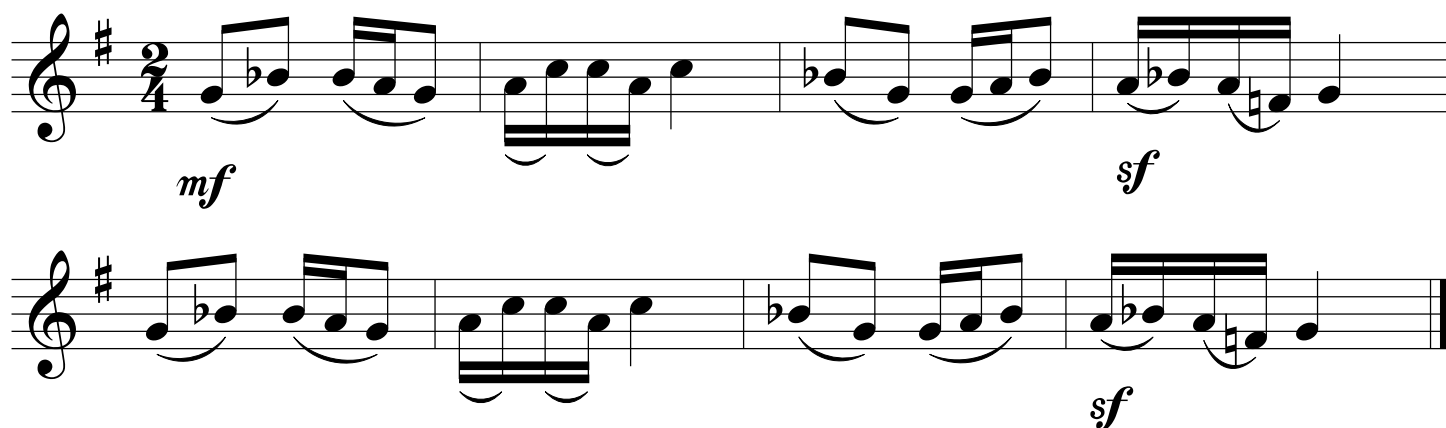

Dvořák la compose durant son séjour aux États-Unis (1892-1896) alors qu'il travaille comme directeur du Conservatoire de New York. La partition est écrite entre janvier et mai 1893,
